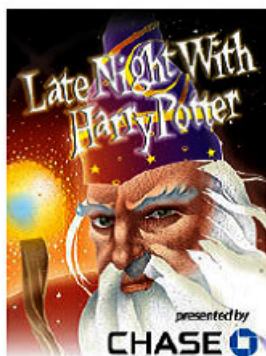

(Free and Open to the Public)

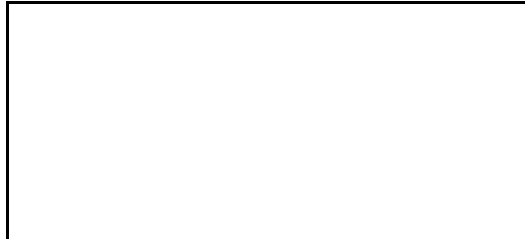
**No scheduled sessions for July.**

August 17	9:00	Observing the moon and deep sky objects. See a crescent moon and the brighter deep sky objects. Perseid Meteor Shower. See Jupiter (GRS transit 1:30am)
August 24	9:00	Observing the moon and deep sky objects. See a gibbous moon and the brighter deep sky objects. See Jupiter (GRS transit 2:22am).
September 7	8:30	Deep sky observing. <b>Novice Night</b> - Bring your telescope or binoculars and let us show you what you can see. See Jupiter (GRS transit 4:00 am).
September 21	8:00	Observing the moon and deep sky objects. Locate Cygnus the Swan.

Note: All observatory dates fall on a Friday, and are held at Froemming Park, on 51<sup>st</sup> Street between Ryan Rd. and Puetz Rd.
